As always if you see something that needs attention, contact Donnie, Pastor Scott or myself and we'll do our best to "get 'r' done"! (Or at least put it on the list)





Our church's Mission Committee is looking for a few new members. We meet for business 4-6 times a year or as needed. Our next meeting is at 2 PM on Thursday, September 14, 2023.

What do we do? Often, we sponsor one "hands-on" mission project a year. This year it was the Red Bird shoeboxes collected during Lent. In the past, we have collected health kits and cleaning kits (flood buckets). This year we also sponsored the coffee hour on Palm Sunday that celebrated the shoeboxes, educated people about the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR), and collected money for UMCOR's work in Ukraine that the committee matched up to \$200. We made our goal and more!

In June, we honored two church members Sandy Trepanier and Donnie Norton with mission recognition pins. We also awarded scholarships to three students who are part of our church family for their studies at college. For about a decade, we have given scholarships to help young people to go to college or church camps. In the recent past, we have made and delivered small Christmas baskets for people who are homebound. We are in the process of reviewing the project which had been carried out by United Methodist Women before the local group disbanded.
