The Ticonderoga Food Pantry

Hours of operation: Monday, Wednesday, Friday: 11am-Noon.

The demand for food from the Food Pantry is now at a record level for the last five years. Lately we've had around 85 households a month coming in. This includes single people, big families, and everyone in between. We are moving three or four tons of food a month. The people of Ticonderoga and Putnam do not have to go hungry if they are in need. This is especially important when it comes to children and the elderly.

The pantry makes sure people receive nutritious food for their family. People and families receive soups, vegetables, meats, fruits, bread, eggs, milk, and margarine, along with many other interesting choices of foods. We try to make the experience uplifting for the needy customer.
