The Ticonderoga Food Pantry

Thank you all for your continued support of the Ticonderoga Food Pantry.

Hours of operation: Monday, Wednesday, Friday: 11am-Noon.

The Ticonderoga Food Pantry helped 237 hungry people in October, including 71 children and 51 older people. The level of need for the pantry's food is more than 30 percent higher than last year. Sometimes people's food stamps run out, or they lose a job, or whatever circumstance, and they are in need.

Thank you's and the occasional tear are seen as people are assisted. People must eat well in order to think and live and function well.

Our volunteers continued to work together seamlessly and joyfully, taking people's information and filling requests, and processing incoming food.

In November, the Credit Union sponsored a food drive, and their customers filled up a couple of bins with food they were donating. This type of help from the community is wonderful and directly helpful.

This helps, but much more food must be purchased, mostly from the regional food bank near Albany, and private donations are essential to allowing this to happen. Please keep giving!!
