Two years of Sunday to Saturday trips to North Carolina to care for my parents and all the logistics around them being admitted to their care facilities and Hospice, and the legal stuff with POA's etc., and now these two months. As I write I have been staying night and day with my Mom providing nursing care to her. The nights are hard as I lightly sleep to listen for movement so I can help her multiple times a night to the commode, clean up, and back to bed. There are only moments when she recognizes me as her son now. She has been praying to die for the last month and yet she persists in limbo unable to stand and walk and grieving her losses of autonomy, control, and memory.

Every time Mom stops breathing I watch and listen, was that her last breath? And then she inhales and continues. This is in God's hands. I am learning to be at peace with living in God's timing, God's control, God's loving presence.

My first day here Mom asked me to move the quilt in front of her bed and fill the space with paintings. I am 'ON' 24/7, feeling isolated and exhausted, so the quiet moments when I can draw and paint are a blessing that ground and nurture my soul. When I post them on Facebook and there are responses, I feel connected to all of you and that gives me the energy to keep going on.

I am looking forward to being back with all of you! And I am so grateful for the care and work of so many of you as you engage with the ministries and outreach of TiFUMC making a huge positive difference in the community. You are amazing followers of Jesus Christ!
