

Tax Statements Envelopes for Special and Seasonal Sundays

In the New Year, I will be preparing annual tax statements for all who want one. I will have a checklist made up to let you indicate whether you do or don't want a statement for your records, and if you want print or emailed statements. You can always leave a note or message for me.

Special Sunday envelopes are no longer being printed, but we have a stash of envelopes in the office to use. Some envelopes say Advent, some say Lent, and some are all purpose. Feel free to use an all-purpose envelope for any Special Sunday or other UMCOR purpose - just make a note saying where you want the gift to go.

Any time you use an envelope, please put your name on it, unless your name is on a check inside. This is how I know what to record for your Tax Statement. Numbers on boxes of envelopes to *not* indicate a person or family. If you prefer to be anonymous, that is absolutely fine.
